



Lucas Giolito knew a little something about throwing no-hitters before he tossed the 19th no-no in White Sox franchise history Tuesday night.

Giolito didn't allow any hits in a complete-game shutout against the Syracuse Chiefs while pitching for Triple-A Charlotte in a seven-inning doubleheader matchup on May 25, 2017. But he also threw multiple no-nos already this year -- albeit virtually. Representing the White Sox, Giolito threw a pair of no-hitters (one with teammate Dallas Keuchel on the mound, and another with himself pitching) during this spring's MLB The Show Players League video game tournament. Giolito went on to the tournament final before losing to Rays ace Blake Snell.

Giolito's no-hitter with Keuchel was oh-so-close to a perfect game, but he pressed the wrong button and threw to second base instead of first after a dropped third strike, allowing a baserunner to reach. His second no-no came against Carl Edwards Jr.'s Mariners -- one of two thrown against Edwards on the same day -- with himself on the mound, and he even had White Sox play-by-play broadcaster Jason Benetti on the call, just as Benetti and color commentator Steve Stone were on the mic in real life in

Chicago on Tuesday night.

Giolito raised his arms, flexed, pounded his chest and yelled, "That's a perfect game!" back on that day in April when he got Edwards Jr. to hit a grounder to second for the final out ... before Benetti gently reminded him that he hit a batter.

CHICAGO -- The first career no-hitter for Lucas Giolito, thrown Tuesday night in a 4-0 White Sox victory over the Pirates, also was the first no-hitter caught by James McCann.

But when Giolito reached the ninth inning at Guaranteed Rate Field, McCann flashed back to the no-hitter that almost was with Justin Verlander and the Tigers. Verlander went eight no-hit innings on Aug. 26, 2015, at home against the Angels, before Chris Iannetta opened the ninth with a double to left.

"I relived the pitch that we threw, that we gave up the no-hitter on, back in 2015," McCann said. "I just kept thinking to myself every pitch is 0-2. We're not trying to steal a strike here, we're trying to make a nasty, perfect pitch, every pitch from here on out and he did it."

"He made his pitches. I looked out there and in his eyes, I couldn't tell the difference whether it was the ninth and the no-hitter was on the line or if it was the first inning. So tip your cap to him. He did a great job holding his composure throughout the game."

With a 0-2 count on Erik González and two outs in the ninth, McCann called for a high fastball and Giolito fired a four-seamer at 96.6 mph. The pitch wasn't exactly where Giolito wanted it and González, who was the Pirates' only baserunner via a four-pitch walk in the fourth, made good contact. But right fielder Adam Engel made the running catch to end the 19th no-hitter in franchise history.

"It's very similar to how I lost my no-hitter with Verlander," s

CHICAGO -- With 30 swinging strikes and 13 strikeouts, Lucas **Giolito** didn't need a great deal of defensive help to finish off the first **no-hitter** thrown this season and his first big league **no-hitter** in a 4-0 White Sox victory over the Pirates on Tuesday night at Guaranteed Rate Field.

But there were two plays in particular that helped complete this mound masterpiece in which **Giolito** faced one batter over the minimum.

The game ended on an 0-2, 96.6 mph four-seamer thrown to Erik González after **Giolito** took a deep breath on the mound. González roped a 102.6 mph shot to right with an expected batting average of .850. But Adam Engel, a Gold Glove-caliber defensive player, got a great jump and snared the ball just below his waist as it started to tail.

"Oh yeah, I owe Engy something," **Giolito** said. "We got ahead with sliders, and for me, I knew [catcher James] McCann was going to call the high fastball. I was about ready to throw it to the backstop.

"Unfortunately, I pulled it down a little bit. I looked at the pitch again, it wasn't a terrible pitch. But I think he was ready for the heater, and he put a really good swing on it. That's part of a **no-hitter**. There's always like that one play, right? And I guess that was the one."

White Sox right-hander Lucas **Giolito** made history on Tuesday night at Chicago's Guaranteed Rate Field, no-hitting the Pirates in a dominant 13-strikeout performance.

Giolito was somewhat familiar with that **no-hitter** feeling before Tuesday night. On May 25, 2017, **Giolito** held the Syracuse Chiefs hitless while pitching for Triple-A Charlotte -- though that game only lasted seven innings as it was the first game of a doubleheader with Minor League rules.

Despite that success as a top prospect, **Giolito's no-hitter** also represented the continuation of his comeback from a disastrous 2018 season in which he posted MLB's highest ERA (6.13) and allowed the most earned runs (118). **Giolito** recovered to become an All-Star in 2019 and now is the fourth pitcher to have the highest qualified ERA in a season and then go on to throw a **no-hitter** later in his career.

According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the previous pitchers to manage that sort of transformation were Edinson Vólquez (highest ERA in 2013, **no-hitter** in '17), Dennis Martinez (1985, '91) and Rick Wise (1968, '71). **Giolito's** 6.13 ERA is also the highest by a pitcher in a qualified season who went on to throw a

CHICAGO -- Lucas **Giolito** always envisioned throwing a **no-hitter**, just as he did for the White Sox in a 4-0 victory over the Pirates Tuesday night at Guaranteed Rate Field.

But when **Giolito** was toiling during the 2018 campaign with a 6.13 ERA over 32 starts -- the worst mark among all qualified pitchers -- an exercise in mound dominance such as Tuesday's might have been a little further back in his mind.

"If you would've asked me about it in '18, I probably would've been like, 'What the hell are you talking about?'" **Giolito** said. "But that was a weird year. I think it's just a product of hard work, determination, learning how to trust myself, trust my stuff."

Giolito changed his delivery, rebuilt his mindset and refined his daily work in between starts during the offseason following 2018. He morphed into an All-Star in 2019, throwing shutouts against the Twins and the Astros -- two of the game's best offenses -- in their own parks. And now with the first **no-hitter** thrown in 2020 and the 19th in franchise history, executed over 101 pitches, **Giolito** has established himself as a true top-of-the-rotation presence.

"I've seen him a bunch of times, having been in the [American League] Central. By far the best I've seen him. Complete control," said Pirates

If you throw a no-hitter against the Pittsburgh Pirates and there are no fans in the stands to witness it, does it still count?

Yes. Absolutely.

In the most abnormal circumstances -- with only cardboard cutouts in the background to celebrate in the stands -- Lucas Giolito threw the 19th no-hitter in White Sox history Tuesday night at Guaranteed Rate Field, blanking the Pirates 4-0.

Only a walk of Erik Gonzalez in the fourth inning held back perfection as the 26-year-old struck out 13 Pirates.

"After the seventh inning, it was like, 'I got six outs left. We're going to make this happen,'" Giolito said. "I looked at who was coming up and I was like, 'This is very much within the realm of possibilities.'"

For those lucky enough to throw a no-hitter, they remember it forever, but Giolito did it without fans in stands, an odd quirk in an extremely odd year.

"2020 has been a very strange year. Obviously a lot of weird stuff going on with COVID, the world -- the state of the world," Giolito said. "So, you know, might as well just throw this in the mix too."

Just wait until you hear the stories of all the fans claiming to have been there.

But the right-hander noticed that the artificial crowd noise was pumped up late in the game as the no-hitter became more of a reality. And with everyone locked in on getting the final outs, the lack of fans in the stands hardly mattered in the ninth inning. That's not to say the presence of fans is inconsequential -- these are just ath

They were All Stars together last season. And that was pretty cool.

But this summer Tuesday was better.

Lucas Giolito and James McCann teamed to complete the 19th no-hitter in White Sox history Tuesday night against the Pittsburgh Pirates. Not bad for the pitcher who posted the worst numbers in baseball during the 2018 season and the catcher who got non-tendered by the rebuilding Detroit Tigers.

"We both had a down 2018. People wrote him off, people wrote me off," McCann said after the game.

"And then all of a sudden, we're both All Stars together in 2019.

"We talked about it tonight. As special as that 2019 All-Star Game was with him and (José) Abreu, tonight is on another level. Tonight's something that I'll never forget, something he'll never forget.

"There is a bond to proving people wrong, continuing to work and continuing to prove people wrong."

Giolito and McCann established that special kind of working relationship last season, when both transformed their games and turned their careers around with exceptional 2019 campaigns. As Giolito rose from long-term mystery to the ace of the South Side staff, he heaped credit on McCann for helping him along the way.

The White Sox might have handed the richest free-agent contract in franchise history to Yasmani Grandal, a catcher, in the offseason, envisioning him catching Giolito's biggest games for years to come.

But with McCann still under contract for 2020, he was the one who got to serve as the backstop Tuesd

The White Sox are surging, and they're putting on a show so entertaining that you'll never forget the moment they went from rebuilders to contenders. It doesn't get more "elite" than that for Lucas G-Elite-O. Giolito carved out his own place in White Sox history Tuesday night, throwing a no-hitter in a 4-0 win over the visiting Pittsburgh Pirates, the 19th time a White Sox pitcher has no-hit an opponent. Only a fourthinning walk kept him from perfection. Giolito joined Mark Buehrle and Philip Humber as the only White Sox pitchers to throw no-hitters this century. Prior to Tuesday, Humber's was the most recent; he threw a perfect game against the Seattle Mariners on April 21, 2012. Giolito joined Buehrle as the only White Sox pitchers to throw a no-hitter on the South Side in the last 50 years. Giolito was masterful Tuesday, completely dominant and incredibly efficient. He struck out 13 Pirates hitters, matching a new career high, the same thing he did in his last start against the Detroit Tigers. But he worked quickly, using just 101 pitches to record 27 outs in nine innings. He faced just one over the minimum, walking the leadoff man in the fourth inning. No Pirate reached base after that. The accomplishment adds to Giolito's remarkable ascent to ace status in the South Side starting rotation.

Two years ago, he was the starting pitcher with the worst statistics in baseball. Last year he was an All Star. Now he's got a no-hitter on his resume. He's made his way to being one of the best pitchers in the American League.

"He is that guy. I really don't need anymore convincing," manager Rick Renteria said of his

Lucas Giolito never felt nervous.

Inning after inning. Zero after zero.

The Chicago White Sox right-hander was in complete control Tuesday against the Pittsburgh Pirates.

"It felt normal, going out in the ninth inning; it didn't feel too much different," Giolito said. "It felt like, 'It's time to close out a ballgame.' And luckily, we were able to do it."

He closed it out — and made history.

Giolito tossed the 19th no-hitter in White Sox history — and the first since 2012 — in a 4-0 victory over the Pirates at Guaranteed Rate Field.

Shortstop Erik Gonzalez hit a sinking line drive to right fielder Adam Engel for the final out.

"I knew (catcher James) McCann was going to call the high fastball, (and) I was about ready to throw it to the backstop," Giolito said. "Unfortunately, I pulled it down a little bit. It wasn't a terrible pitch, but I think he was ready for the heater and he put a really good swing on it."

"A no-hitter is not all the pitcher, ever. There's always that amazing defensive play, that solid defense behind you, the catcher back there. Credit goes to the entire team behind me."

Giolito had an early idea that Tuesday night might be special.

"I knew it was working after the first inning, a nice 1-2-3 inning," he said. "And then it kept building and building."

"After the seventh, it was like, 'I've got six outs left, we're going to make this happen.'"

Giolito struck out 13, matching a career high, and allowed only one baserunner, a leadoff walk in

While becoming the first pitcher to throw a no-hitter in a fan-free ballpark, Lucas Giolito said he noticed the Chicago White Sox had turned up the fake crowd noise in the late innings to make it feel more real.

"The crowd noise was getting louder and louder as the game went on," he said. "That was fun."

Keeping it real has been a habit of Giolito's. He never made excuses for his rough outings in 2018, and he continues to reap the rewards of his hard work and perseverance.

On a night when he had everything in his arsenal working and a solid defense behind him, Giolito brought a buzz to the South Side that more than made up for the lack of fans.

Striking out 13 and walking only one in a 101-pitch outing, Giolito made history and continued one of the wildest stretches in Sox annals, including four straight home runs against the Cardinals, six home runs in three games at Wrigley Field by Jose Abreu and a video featuring a dancing Don Cooper imitating John Travolta.

Wearing a Bulls jersey and a surgical mask, Giolito told reporters long after his no-hitter that it still hadn't completely sunk in.

"But 2020 has been a very strange year," he said. "Obviously a lot of weird stuff going on with COVID, the state of the world, so might as well throw this in the mix, too."

Might as well.

Giolito knew the no-no was in sight after the seventh inning, looking at the Pirates hitters he would be facing in the eighth and ninth and feeling good about every matchup.

At the best moment of Lucas Giolito's career, he thought of the worst.

When he couldn't get anybody out and couldn't figure out why, when every time he climbed a mound he knew he would "get [his] ass kicked," when he was by most measures the worst pitcher in baseball, in the spring of 2018, he happened to board a hotel elevator alongside his manager, White Sox skipper Rick Renteria.

Renteria grabbed him by the back of the neck. "I know you're going to be an All-Star one day," he said. Giolito considered his 7.53 ERA, his latest clunker in a string of them, his total inability to put the ball where he wanted it. And he believed Renteria. Wearing a Bulls jersey and a surgical mask, his hair still glistening from the beer shower his teammates had given him, Giolito took the podium on Tuesday, less than an hour removed from throwing his first nohitter, and thought back to that elevator ride. In 2012, he had been the Nationals' first-round pick out of Harvard-Westlake (Los Angeles) high school. In '16, he was the top pitching prospect in the sport. In '17, he was the essential piece in the deal that netted Washington outfielder Adam Eaton. In '18, Giolito was the most disappointing player in the game. That winter, he entirely remade his delivery, with the help of his high school pitching coach, Ethan Katz, and he honed his mentality. In '19, Giolito was an All-Star. And in '20, he threw the first no-hitter of the season.

He strikes out 13, walks one in dominant performance against the Pirates. The White Sox' entertainment value is absurd these days. Just absurd.

On Tuesday night, it was Lucas **Giolito**'s turn to captivate the masses. All that talent of his coalesced in nine innings of near perfection, a 13-strikeout, one-walk **no-hitter** against the Pirates at Guaranteed Rate Field.

For the Sox, the hits just keep coming, with each day seeming to bring a new homage to youth and talent and the special gift of not knowing any better. If it's not **Giolito**'s 4-0, no-hit victory, it's Jose Abreu's home run-alooza...in a game against the Cardinals, it's their six home runs in a game against the Tigers a day later.

All that in a 10-day span. Insane fun.

Sox tickets are impossible to get. OK, bad COVID-19 joke, but thank goodness for this team in these dark times. And thank goodness for **Giolito** on a warm Chicago night with nobody in the stands because of a stupid pandemic that has worn out a welcome it never got in the first place.

Giolito threw 101 pitches Tuesday night. Pirates batters swung and missed at 30 of them. In words, that stat is a hitter... saying, "Your guess is as good as mine." **Giolito** threw heat. He threw breaking balls that initially looked like water but turned out to be a dry, dusty mirage.

He's the son of an actress and the grandson of an actor, so it makes sense that the last out, a real cliffhanger, would be slathered with climactic tension. On an... 0-2 count, the Pirates' Erik Gonzalez ripped a low line drive to right. The ball was struck on the meat of the bat, and it had "**no-hitter** buzz kill" written all over it.

Upon contact, **Giolito**'s body language spoke of defeat and resignation, but his body didn't know what it was talking about. Adam Engel got a great jump and made a difficult play look fairly easy, bending low to snag the ball out of the... air. **Giolito** had his **no-hitter**, statistically perhaps the most dominant in team history, though Mark Buehrle's two-hour, three-minute perfect game in 2009 might beg to differ.

These Sox. After all they put their fan base through during a painful rebuild, now they deliver with a 10-day epic saga that makes you... fully understand what all the fuss is about. All this talent – **Giolito**, Abreu, Tim Anderson, Luis Robert, Eloy Jimenez, Yoan Moncada, etc. Dylan Cease has put together five good starts. Cease is young, right? Well, the 26-year-old **Giolito** is only a year and a half older.

The Sox lead the majors with a .267 batting average and a .479 slugging percentage.

So...matter had gone to court, a jury would have found him guilty of felony trespassing. And Jimenez played the moment perfectly, never moving and giving Robert a long "you've got to be kidding me" stare. Robert laughed. When you're young, either things fit or you make them fit. That's all.

Giolito didn't get the in-house celebration he deserved Tuesday night. Teammates swarmed him after the last out, but there were no fans in attendance to watch it, unless you count the cardboard cutouts, and if you do, stop.

"They turned up the crowd noise," **Giolito** told MLB Network, laughing. "It..."

Special bond formed between pitcher and catch will likely be severed after this season. Something must have been slightly amiss between right-hander Lucas **Giolito** and James McCann Tuesday night.

Giolito actually shook off a pitch called by his catcher.

"He shook early in the game, and it kind of caught me off guard," McCann said. "I can literally think of maybe three times in our entire history together where he's shaken off. It's just kind... of one of those things, that trust that we've had, I don't know if I've ever had that with another pitcher in my career."

One thing McCann does know: He had never caught a **no-hitter** until **Giolito** pitched a 101-pitch masterpiece with one walk against the Pirates concluding with his last call of the night, a 97 mph-fastball to Erik Gonzalez lined to right field and caught by Adam Engel.

As usual, **Giolito** let McCann's fingers do the pitch calling. For... 100 of the 101 pitches, anyway.

"It felt like a typical outing," **Giolito** said. "I'm letting him do all the thinking, letting him read the hitters. I'm paying attention, I'm seeing what they're doing. It was one of those nights where we were really in sync. Like I had the grip ready to go, and he was putting the signs down. Obviously, the... relationship we have on and off the field is stupendous. I mean, I can't say enough good things about him. He was such a huge part of what happened tonight."

What happened was the 19th **no-hitter** in Sox history and the first in baseball in 2020. **Giolito** says McCann deserves a big assist.

"I didn't say anything to him throughout the game other than 'stay aggressive and keep getting after it,'" McCann said. "I pretty much told him that after every inning. Nothing... changed from really after the bullpen in the beginning of the game to after the eighth. I kept telling him stay aggressive, keep attacking and attack, attack, attack."

When **Giolito** shakes McCann, it's a story. He did zero times when he threw seven innings of scoreless ball with 13 strikeouts in his previous start against the Tigers Thursday.

McCann, the Sox' No. 2 catcher behind Yasmani Grandal, is likely going to be missed before long because he will be a free... agent after the season.

McCann formed a bond during his first season with the Sox in 2019. **Giolito**, coming off a horrible year in 2018 when he led the majors in ERA, changed his motion and also jelled with McCann, who also had a turnaround season making the All-Star team after the Tigers non-tendered him. Dealing with adversity is one of the things that pulled them together.

"We...McCann will want to be a starter somewhere and the Sox are committed to Yasmani Grandal as their No. 1 catcher. Grandal signed a \$73 million deal in the offseason, the richest in Sox history.

While he's still here, McCann probably hopes he gets as many starts as he can with **Giolito** pitching.

"Lucas is an unbelievable pitcher and he has great stuff," McCann said, "and I think our relationship just kind of takes it to the next level. He's really bought into how I call a game and how I manage a game, and it's worked. He trusts me, I trust..."

Giolito strikes out 13, walks one in 4-0 Sox victory On Lucas **Giolito** nights, the White Sox believe it's their night.

On Tuesday, it was **Giolito**'s night.

The 6-6 right-hander threw the Sox' first **no-hitter** in eight seasons and the first in baseball this season, blanking the Pittsburgh Pirates in... a 4-0 White Sox victory at Guaranteed Rate Field.

Giolito struck out xx. He retired Jarrod Dyson on a strikeout, pinch hitter Jose Osuna on a foul fly to right fielder Adam Engel and Erik Gonzalez on a liner to Engel in the ninth before getting mobbed by teammates.

Giolito is their All-Star and their Opening Day starter, and with...all due respect to former Cy Young winner Dallas Keuchel (4-2, 2.65), he took a strong hold of the Sox' ace role as the one who was nearly flawless five days after he struck out 13 Tigers in seven scoreless innings.

Jose Abreu said the Sox do believe they'll win with **Giolito** pitching, but having won seven of their last eight games and looking like a postseason team at the midway point of this 60-game season, they feel like they're going to win every night.

"He's a guy who has matured 100 percent," Jose Abreu said before the game. "He is a guy...good pitcher."

"I can tell you that every time he is on the mound we feel like we're going to win because we feel like we're going to win every single day we go out on the field. It doesn't matter if Lucas is the pitcher or somebody else."

The way **Giolito** dominated the Pirates, though, clearly set him apart. Through seven innings, the only Pirates baserunner was Gonzalez, who walked on four pitches leading off the fourth. **Giolito** had 10 strikeouts through seven.

Their best chance at a hit came in the seventh, but shortstop Tim Anderson ranged from behind second... base ranging to his right and threw out Bryan Reynolds on a close play at first. Jose Abreu's scoop completed the play.

The last Sox **no-hitter** was by right-hander Philip Humber, who threw a perfect game at Seattle on April 21, 2012.

"He is one of those guys that as long as he continues to remain focused and just be himself, he's got the stuff to be able to eat through pretty good lineups,"... manager Rick Renteria said of **Giolito** before the game. "Command of his fastball [in the 13-strikeout gem against the Tigers] was one of the main things, but his secondary pitches work off that fastball and he's able to command those secondary pitches and use them at any time. It makes him pretty effective."

Chicago White Sox starter Lucas Giolito, who comes from a movie family, just wrote one of baseball's finest Hollywood scripts, pitching the first no-hitter in the pandemic season of 2020 and the first by a pitcher who ever had an ERA of 6.00 or higher in a previous season.

"2020 has been a very strange year," Giolito said. "Obviously, a lot of weird stuff going on. COVID. The state of the world. Might as well just throw this in the mix too."

Two years ago Giolito had the worst ERA in baseball. But during this 4-0 win against the Pittsburgh Pirates, he struck out a career-high 13 batters, generating 30 swings and misses, and only one walk away from a perfect game.

"It's crazy, man," Giolito said. "The weird thing is I always envisioned I'd throw a no-hitter."

"If you asked me in 2018 [10-13, 6.13 ERA], I'd say, 'What the hell you talking about?' It's just a product of hard work, determination, trusting my stuff, trusting myself. ... I knew it was in there."

It was the first no-hitter in baseball history with no fans in the crowd, but you could still hear the screaming and cheering from his teammates, with catcher James McCann giving him a bear hug, and his teammates gathering around him on the mound.





Midway through a season most of us will eventually try to forget, Lucas **giolito** reminded us why so many wanted baseball back to begin with.

His **no-hitter** Tuesday night in Chicago was certainly the quietest of the 19 pitched in White Sox history. The cardboard cutouts on hand to witness a slice of history probably didn't even bother to save their ticket stubs.... But in a season where accomplishments are hard to measure, **giolito** served up one that fits easily into the record books. The first **no-hitter** of the pandemic era looked a lot like any **no-hitter**, complete with a celebration on the mound afterward that didn't exactly follow virus protocol.

Turns out baseball really is just baseball, even with seven-inning... doubleheaders, playoffs for almost everyone and ill-fitting masks everywhere.

'œ2020 has been a very strange year,'? **giolito** said through his own mask afterward. 'œObviously a lot of weird stuff going on with COVID and the state of the world, so may as well throw this in the mix.'?

It was just one night, and the fake crowd noises were noticeable to anyone tuning in on TV. The opposition...almost doubled their win total for the year.

But the beauty of **giolito**'s no-no was that it was as legitimate as any thrown in a normal season. And for the first time this year, baseball got the kind of moment that it seemed the weirdest season ever would never deliver. That **giolito** is now on pace to win just six games this year wasn't brought up, at least for a moment. Neither was the fact that he's not only the sole pitcher in the American League with a **no-hitter** this year, but the only one with a complete game shutout.

He's...arrive at full-season stats, but few fans have the patience to pull up calculators on their phones and run numbers every time a player does something that looks statistically interesting.

It's hard to even figure out the standings, with some teams playing far fewer games than others because of COVID-19 postponements.

A **no-hitter**? Well, that's something we all understand.

And the best part is it didn't happen in a seven-inning game, which would have sent baseball purists in a frantic search for asterisks to attach to the feat. **Giolito** pitched the kind of **no-hitter** that dominant pitchers of the...walking just one while striking out 13. He needed just 101 pitches and threw 74 of them for strikes.

There was a bit of drama at the end, when a sinking line drive by Erik Gonzalez was snagged by right fielder Adam Engel at knee height. The cardboard cutouts didn't give **Giolito** a standing ovation, but his teammates swarmed over to him and it seemed almost natural for those watching on TV.

'œThey turned up the (automated) crowd noise. I noticed that,'? **Giolito** said. 'œThe crowd noise was getting louder and louder as the game went on. That was fun. At the...would have been great to pull that off with fans in the stands and be able to kind of look out there after it was all done and see how excited they were. I'm sure a lot of White Sox fans were excited from their homes watching it on TV.'?

For **Giolito**, it was affirmation that he can be an elite major league pitcher, something he wasn't so sure of after a miserable 2018 season, when he gave up a league-leading 118 earned runs for the White Sox. A highly touted prospect, the 26-year-old said he had to learn from failure... to reach the pinnacle of success. But he never gave up, and he persevered through the tough times. **Giolito** said he could see this day coming, even if the day didn't quite look the same as he thought.

Fortunately for the White Sox, starting pitcher Lucas **Giolito** was even more electric Tuesday night. The 26-year-old right-hander fired a **no-hitter** to lead the White Sox to a 4-0 victory over the visiting Pittsburgh Pirates for their eighth win in their last nine games.

Giolito struck out 13, matching a career high he set in his last... start. The only hitter who reached was Erik Gonzalez, who led off the fourth with a walk.

"I knew it was working after the first inning," **Giolito** said. "Nice 1-2-3 inning and then it just kept building and building. After the sixth inning is when I really started to notice what was going on. Then after the seventh, it was like, 'I got 6 outs left. We're going to make this happen.' "

It was the White Sox's... 19th **no-hitter** and first since Philip Humber tossed a perfect game against the Seattle Mariners on April 21, 2012.

Giolito retired the first nine batters he faced before Gonzalez coaxed a four-pitch pass. Shortstop Tim Anderson kept the **no-hitter** intact with a defensive gem in the seventh, making... a running throw on a softly hit ball off the bat of Bryan Reynolds for the second out of the inning. Jose Abreu deftly snagged the one-hop throw. **Giolito** was coming off his best start of the season, a 13-strikeout effort against the Detroit Tigers that saw him throw 7 scoreless innings. He started the Pittsburgh ninth by striking out Jarrod Dyson on a check-swing. Jose Osuna fouled out to right fielder Adam Engel, and then Engel stabbed Gonzalez's...the bat, I broke in. It was well hit and low," Engel said. "It was basically an easy read. I got a good jump and just tried to run through the baseball, like all the reps I've taken out there. Made the catch, and it was an incredible feeling seeing **Giolito** accomplish that feat."

With James McCann catching him, **Giolito** threw 101 pitches, 74 strikes. After the final out, **Giolito**'s teammates hugged and high-fived him, never mind the MLB's recommended social-distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic.

While the slugging White Sox didn't homer, they pounded out 9 hits, including 3 by rookie Luis...team, and one of the most remarkable things is we have a different hero every night.

"It's not just me. One day it can be Lucas, one day it could be Eloy (Jimenez), or (Luis) Robert, or (Yoan) Moncada, Dallas (Keuchel)."

Tuesday night, the hero was obvious. Mind you, two seasons ago, **Giolito** posted a 6.13 ERA in 32 starts, before making the all-star team last year.

"It's crazy, man," **Giolito** said. "The weird thing is that I always envisioned that I'd throw a **no-hitter** in the big leagues. If you would have asked me that in 2018, I probably..."



CHICAGO - Lucas **giolito** pitched the first **no-hitter** of the pandemic-delayed major league season, striking out 13 and permitting just one...empty, the hollers of his teammates echoed around the ballpark after right fielder Adam Engel extended to catch Erik Gonzalez's slicing drive toward the line for the final out.

"I've been working for this type of game for a while now and it's really cool that we got it done," **giolito** said.

An All-Star last year, the 26-year-old **giolito** (3-2) matched his career high for strikeouts set in his previous start against Detroit.

Only a four-pitch walk to Gonzalez leading off the fourth inning got in **giolito**'s way of perfection. The right-hander threw 101 pitches and made quick work of... the Pirates -- Pittsburgh came into the game batting just .229 this season and has the worst record in the majors.

The White Sox rushed toward the mound after the final out in **giolito**'s first career **no-hitter**. **giolito** hugged catcher James McCann as the Chicago players joined the celebration.

giolito was fully aware in the later innings what was at stake.

"After the seventh, six more outs, looking at who I was facing, became very, very, very possible," he said, "and then we... were able to get it done."

giolito said his approach never wavered.

"Just staying with the same, like, mental routine for every single pitch. One pitch at a time. Full focus, full execution, straight through the target," he said.

giolito pitched the 19th **no-hitter** in White Sox history and first since Philip Humber threw...ninth, Gonzalez hit a liner that Engel, a fleet center fielder for most of his career, caught on the run at knee-high height.

"Yeah man, I think I got it," Gonzalez said. "With that at-bat, I was a little bit mad because I don't want to be part of history."

giolito improved to 30-28 in his big league career. He made his debut with Washington in 2016, then was traded after that season to the White Sox in a package for outfielder Adam Eaton.

giolito threw the first **no-hitter** at Guaranteed Rate Field since Minnesota's Francisco Liriano did... it in 2011.

The White Sox, who've won eight of their last nine, ended the Pirates' season-best winning streak at three games.

giolito was dominant in his previous start, too, fanning 13 against Detroit and allowing just three hits in seven innings. The victory over Pittsburgh was his third career shutout.

giolito went to full counts against just two hitters but retired both before the sixth.

"I don't have any words," White Sox manager Rick Renteria said Tuesday night, before adding four of them: "I want to cry."

"I don't have words to really describe it," White Sox catcher James McCann said a little bit later, but he mustered some anyway for his good friend and battery mate.

Lucas Giolito, the man of the late hour, had enough words to describe his first no-hitter, but on Tuesday night, he was still battling with the reality of it all.

"It still hasn't fully sunk in yet," Giolito said while wearing a mask and a Bulls jersey on a Zoom call. "It probably won't until tomorrow. Twenty-twenty has been a very strange year. Obviously, a lot of weird stuff with COVID and the state of the world. We might as well throw this in the mix too."

As the outs dwindled to one, veteran broadcaster Steve Stone told his junior partner Jason Benetti to take over and it was Benetti, the Sox fan living out his boyhood dream, who called the ending by himself. He found the words.

"To right field, Adam Engel ... is there! A no-hitter! The 19th in White Sox history!"

With no fans in the stands and barely any major-league hitters on the opposing team, Giolito was transcendent. He needed just 101 pitches to get through nine innings and he had his best strikeout stuff for this feat, fanning 13. In the rarefied air of no-hitters, that's Nolan Ryan territory.

Mark Buehrle had six strikeouts in his 2009 perfect game and eight in his 2007 no-hitter. But Buehrle wasn't a strikeout pit

There were a lot of ugly moments in 2018 for Lucas Giolito, but probably the easiest time to get off the bus was Sept. 4, 721 days ago, against a moribund Detroit Tigers offense. Giolito looked in sync through a 1-2-3 first inning with two strikeouts when, absent a mechanical or control breakdown, he just lost control of the game without explanation, throwing 40 pitches to record a single out in the second, before getting pulled and leaving the field in a daze.

Normally incisive and insightful even in the worst moments, Giolito had few answers, saying a version of "I let it get too quick for me" multiple times.

You always saw Giolito's talent. You always could make sense of Giolito's explanations for how or why things went wrong and how they might be fixed soon. But how would it ever all work in the major leagues if that could happen to him? If he was so easily overwhelmed? Between high school injuries, struggles with the Nationals and the 2018 season, his parents, loving him as they did, had got out of the habit of watching his games live.

"I used to watch, but I just can't anymore. My heart — I get too nervous," Giolito's father, Rick, said in a phone call with The Athletic.

"I think we all still believed in Lucas," Adam Engel said a half-hour after he "sprinted through the ball" to grab the final out of the White Sox's 4-0 win Tuesday night. He'll always remember it. "Even back in 2018, even when he was at his low, we all believed."



So many MLB no-hit bids end one out away from fame and glory. Maybe the pitcher tightens up. Maybe his luck runs out. Maybe the batter just hits a good pitch. It appeared Lucas **giolito**'s luck for the Chicago White Sox ended on his 101st pitch on Tuesday night against the Pittsburgh Pirates when Erik Gonzalez lined an 0-2 fastball to right field.

"That last one, man ... oh my god," **giolito** said after the game. "(I threw it) right down the middle....it up on an 0-2 count with two outs. Luckily we have one of the best outfielders in the game playing right field."

It looked like a sure hit, a low 102 mph screamer. Indeed, it had an 85% hit probability, the highest of any ball in play hit off **giolito** in the game. But right fielder Adam Engel was shaded in and towards the line, got a good read on the play and plucked the ball off the tops of his shoes to finish off the first **no-hitter** of the season and the 19th in White Sox history....

"There's always one out in a **no-hitter**," **giolito** said. "I guess that was the one."

It was the most dominant **no-hitter** in White Sox history -- and that's saying something because only the Dodgers have thrown more. **giolito** finished with 13 strikeouts, the first White Sox pitcher to record double digits... in a **no-hitter**. His Game Score of 99 is the highest in franchise history for a nine-inning game and the highest since Wilbur Wood also put up a 99 while throwing an 11-inning shutout in 1974.

Before that final out, shortstop Tim Anderson had preserved the **no-hitter** in the...the right side of second base for the left-handed Reynolds, Anderson ranged back to the shortstop side of the bag and made a nice off-balance throw to nip the speedy Reynolds, with first baseman Jose Abreu digging the ball out of the dirt.

After the third out of that inning, **giolito** admitted that's when he started thinking about the **no-hitter**. "After the seventh, alright, six more outs to go, looking at who I was facing, it became very, very possible," he said.

Despite all the strikeouts, his pitch count remained low and was a non-factor. He gave credit to...a foul pop-up to first base. He fell behind Jarrod Dyson leading off the ninth with two balls, but then got three strikes, including two swinging on his changeup. Jose Osuna fouled out to right field on a 1-2 slider and then Gonzalez swung and missed at two sliders before **giolito** tried to power a fastball past him.

Of course, there were no fans at Guaranteed Rate Field to cheer **giolito** on. "They turned up the crowd noise," he laughed during a postgame interview with MLB Network. "It felt like every single inning the crowd noise got louder. By the... ninth inning the crowd noise got crazy. It felt like there were 35,000 people here."

There were a lot of swings and misses in this game for **giolito** -- 30 of them, the second most in any **no-hitter** since 1990 (Nolan Ryan had 31) and the most for a White Sox pitcher in any game of the pitch-tracking era (since 1988), topping Chris Sale's best of 29.

As Jeff Passan tweeted, "Lucas **giolito** is a...strikeouts in 43 innings and a .180 batting average allowed."

It's been quite the turnaround from 2018. That was his first full season in the majors, his second with the White Sox since coming over from the Nationals in the Adam Eaton trade, and it was not a pretty season. **giolito** finished 10-13 with a 6.13 ERA, the worst ERA among qualifiers. He allowed the most earned runs and the most walks in the American League, hit 15 batters and averaged just 6.5 strikeouts per nine innings. For a pitcher some analysts had once regarded as the best pitching prospect in... the minors it was a disappointing season, the type of results that can ruin a young pitcher.

But **giolito** came back in 2019 much stronger and throwing harder -- and that seemed to give him a lot more confidence. His four-seamer averaged 92.4 mph in 2018, but was up to 94.2 in with 2019, with a higher spin rate as well. Opponents had rocked the four-seamer in 2018 with...26.2%. He's throwing it even more in 2020 -- 34.4% of the time. In some ways, the changeup is his best pitch. He still has a wipeout he uses to put away right-handed batters, but the changeup makes his fastball even better.

In an interview with MLB Network on Monday, **giolito** said he learned the changeup while rehabbing from Tommy John surgery after the Nationals drafted him 2012, just fooling around with different grips. **giolito** fell to the 16th overall pick because of that injury, but after a big season at A-ball in 2014, he became a top prospect...

CHICAGO (AP) Lucas **Giolito** quietly walked to the mound for the ninth inning, piped-in fake crowd noise wafting through the ballpark and cardboard cutouts dotting the stands.

Moments later, in this strangest season of all, the Chicago White Sox right-hander threw the final pitch in a truly bizarre performance.

A no-fan no-no.

With the... seats at Guaranteed Rate Field empty, **Giolito** pitched the first **no-hitter** of the pandemic-delayed year, striking out 13 in leading the White Sox over the Pittsburgh Pirates 4-0 Tuesday night.

"2020 has been a very strange year," said **Giolito**, who conducted a postgame interview while wearing a mask. "Obviously a lot of weird stuff...final out, the hollers of **Giolito**'s teammates in the middle of the diamond echoed around the stadium.

"I'm just stoked for Lucas and so happy and ecstatic and emotional for Lucas," Engel said. "It stinks we couldn't celebrate the way most no-hitters get celebrated."

The smallest crowd listed for any **no-hitter** in the majors over the last 100 years came in 1944, when a mere 1,014 watched Cincinnati's Clyde Shoun beat the Braves at Crosley Field.

Nowhere close to that number on this night, not with the park that holds over 40,000 closed to fans because of virus protocols....**Giolito**'s gem, there will not be, say, 100,000 or so people claiming they were there to see it in person.

At one point early in the game, some members of grounds crew drifted in sight, but that was about it outside of the teams.

An All-Star last year, the 26-year-old **Giolito** (3-2) matched his career high for strikeouts set in his previous start against Detroit.

Only a four-pitch walk to Gonzalez leading off the fourth inning got in **Giolito**'s way of perfection. That was only runner he permitted while throwing 101 pitches

"I've been working for this type of game for... a while now and it's really cool that we got it done," **Giolito** said.

Giolito relied on his changeup and fastball to make quick work of the Pirates, who came into the game batting just .229 and have the worst record in the majors. Six of their starters finished the game hitting under .199 this season.

The White Sox rushed toward the... mound after the final out in **Giolito**'s first career **no-hitter**. **Giolito** hugged catcher James McCann as the Chicago players joined the party.

The South Side of Chicago normally rattles with fireworks after a home win — this is the club that gave the game the exploding scoreboard — but the park remained silent as the dugout emptied....

Giolito, meanwhile, was locked in his own zone in the later innings, fully aware of what was at stake.

"After the seventh, six more outs, looking at who I was facing, became very, very, very possible," he said, "and then we were able to get it done."

Giolito said... his approach never wavered.

"Just staying with the same, like, mental routine for every single pitch. One pitch at a time. Full focus, full execution, straight through the target," he said.

Giolito pitched the 19th **no-hitter** in White Sox history – second most to the Dodgers' 23 – and first since Philip Humber threw a perfect game at Seattle in 2012. This was the seventh time the Pirates have been held hitless, with Washington's Max Scherzer having done it in...ninth, Gonzalez hit a liner that Engel, a fleet center fielder for most of his career, caught on the run at knee-high height.

"Yeah man, I think I got it," Gonzalez said. "With that at-bat, I was a little bit mad because I don't want to be part of history."

Giolito improved to 30-28 in his big league career. He made his debut with Washington in 2016, then was traded after that season to the White Sox in a package for outfielder Adam Eaton.

Giolito gave up a major league-high 118 earned runs in 2018, his first full season in... Chicago.

"I was pretty much bottom of the league in almost every stat," **Giolito** said. "I kind of had to ... learn from failure to learn my true potential."

He added: "I always envisioned that I'd throw a **no-hitter** in the big leagues."

Giolito threw the first **no-hitter** at Guaranteed Rate Field since Minnesota's Francisco Liriano did it in... 2011.

The White Sox, who've won eight of their last nine, ended the Pirates' season-best winning streak at three games.

Giolito was dominant in his previous start, too, fanning 13 against Detroit and allowing just three hits in seven innings. The victory over Pittsburgh was his third career shutout.

Chicago's first three batters reached in the second and all three came home one at a time after Engel's groundout and...
